Your child's appointment

What to bring with you

When you attend the centre please remember to bring your child's:

- Appointment letter
- Parent-held records (Red book) (If your child is under 5 years of age)

When you arrive

It is important that you attend at the stated time, or we will not be able to see your child. Every effort will be made to see you at your appointed time, but delays are sometimes unavoidable. If this happens we will keep you informed.

Sometimes, with your permission, trainee doctors, health visitors or audiologists may be present during your child's appointment. Please let a member of staff know if you would prefer them not to be present.

During the appointment

A Paediatric Audiologist or Paediatrician (children's doctor) will ask you and your child questions about their hearing and will examine their ears. An appropriate test will be chosen based on your child's development to assess their hearing. Testing is normally carried out by 1 or 2 Audiologists. This is usually done by playing a game, during which the Audiologist will assess your child's responses to a range of sounds. This helps to keep your child engaged in a natural and comfortable way. We will also look in your child's ears and, if necessary, check the movement of their eardrums with a soft rubber tip placed in their ear. This is not painful but might tickle slightly.

The results and any further actions, including any future appointments, will be fully explained to you on the day of your appointment.

In some cases the results will be discussed at a later date by telephone (if this is the case the date of the telephone call will be detailed with your appointment letter).

We hope to make your visit to the centre as pleasant as possible. Please let us know of any suggestions you may have for improvement of the service.
